A VISIT TO PIONEER HOMESTEAD SITE AT DALTON.


This beautifully restored single pen cabin is very much the type of home that early pioneers to Northeast Arkansas erected when they came to our state more than twenty years before statehood was declared. This building is only a part of the homestead site being preserved by Black River Technical College's project REACH. The Rice-Upshaw House, along with the Looney Tavern nearby, are being preserved through gifts and government grants so their place in Arkansas's earliest history will not be lost to future generations.


This site is wonderful to see. The split rail fences and the carefully restored cabin are very authentic. In a conversation with Holly Looney, the coordinator of the site, I learned the original house built here was erected about 1830. The Looney Tavern nearby predates this building by about two decades. I visited this historic place in early summer, and the grounds were beautiful with mature trees and native flowers in bloom.


